These gentlemen were recognized earlier this summer during the Florida Association of Career and Technical Education Association's annual conference in Orlando. Without their ongoing efforts, those of






CareerSource CLM and other community partners to educate students, parents, educators, employers and others about careers and training available right here in our own backyard would be a slow slog indeed.


