Mark, who also serves on CareerSource Citrus Levy Marion's board of directors, was recognized for his long-standing efforts to launch programs in partnership with us and other organizations that support Marion County students' career and technical education while preparing them to enter the workforce.



Dr. Heidi Maier, MCPS superintendent who attended the awards program, said that "Mark's passion for learning is only surpassed by his passion for our students. His background and dedication to our students is what fuels him every day. Pair that with a workforcehungry community and you get successful students and amazing corporate partnerships."

Our CEO Rusty Skinner noted that in responding to the needs of the business community, Mark has been pivotal in a number of "talent pipeline" programs that prepare students to enter the workforce with great skills.

Some of those efforts include collaboration in the success of the annual Youth Career Expo and Senior/Youth Job Fair, implementation of a soft skills curriculum taught at all grade levels throughout Marion County's 31 public schools, support of a Duke Foundation-funded video series highlighting the district's Career Choice academies and programs, launch of a new Commercial Driver License (CDL) program at Marion Technical College, creation of new logistics programs at two high schools as well as a short-term Core Construction program at MTI.

Believe me, there's more, but I'll let Mark have the last word.


"Workforce development is a community problem that requires a community


