## **Boiled Peanuts**



Scotty DeLoach, 48, sits on the east side of State Road 345 between Levy County Road 347 and CR 330 on Tuesday afternoon (April 23), where he sells bags of boiled peanuts. State Road 345 runs north and south there, even though a person going from Cedar Key to Chiefland might think they are more eastbound than northbound. For people going from Cedar Key (or Carter's Crossroads) to Chiefland (northbound), the boiled peanut salesman is on the right side. DeLoach said he's been selling boiled peanuts for just over six years now, since his father died on April 18, 2013. The price for his peanuts starts at \$5 for the first bag. Consumers who buy two bags get them for \$4 each (\$8 for two). The price stays at \$4 per bag for bags three (\$12) and four (\$16). People who buy six bags at one time get them for \$20 (which is about \$3.33 for each bag), or the consumer can think of it as buying five bags for \$20 (\$4 each) and then he or she gets the sixth bag for free. Many years ago, DeLoach grew up on the East Coast of Florida, surfing in waves off of Cocoa Beach, in Sebastian Inlet and elsewhere. Back then, the professional surfer lived on Palm Beach and knew famous surfers like Emerson Timmons of Delray Beach and (Robert) Kelly Slater of Cocoa Beach. As for boiled peanut sales in Levy County for the past six years or so, DeLoach said some days are better than others. Generally, Tuesdays, Fridays and Saturdays are the best for boiled peanut sales, he said.
