FDLE updates criminal history webpage

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) has updated Florida's Computerized Criminal History Internet webpage, making it mobile friendly and easier to use.

For \$24 plus a \$1 credit card processing fee, citizens can request a Florida criminal history search from the website.

Results usually returned in seconds.

Criminal history searches are now also available as part of FDLE's Mobile App, allowing quick and easy access to Florida criminal histories.

In addition to criminal histories, FDLE's mobile

app also allows users to search Florida's Sex Offender Registry, unsolved cases and missing persons.

The app is free to download in the Apple App Store and Google Play Store.

Contractor Anthony Messina, representing Levy County School Board, said he is about to start the high school project.

"We have put the roll-off contract out to bid but talking to Waste Pro and talking to Watson C&D, the prices aren't even close," Messina said. "I can get a 20-yard can from Watson C&D for \$300 yet a 20-yard can from Waste Pro is \$300 plus a \$100 delivery fee plus \$51 per ton. "It's almost 300-400 times the cost the Levy County School Board could spend somewhere else on the project."

He then suggested the city develop a roll-off container ordinance.

Tracy Stockburn said he believed the city would make more money by charging an annual franchise fee rather than the current model.

"We all have dump trailers," Stockburn said. "It's a little high to ask people that own their own dump trailers and using them only for their business, to pay a \$1,000 fee to do 2-3 roofs inside the city limits."

He said he did not feel a contractor who used their own equipment should not have to pay to bring that equipment inside the city limits.

Charlie Kennedy said instead of paying \$75 to dump his 75-yard dump trailer he was forced to pay \$4,000 rather than the \$1,500 he would have had to pay using his own trailer.

He suggested charging waste removal companies \$500 per year for a permit and adding \$25 for contractors who use their own dump trailers.

"When you come into a city like Chiefland and you have no idea about Waste Pro and you ask for a permit and are told

you have to go through Waste Pro, I thought this was still America where you could use whoever you wanted to," Kennedy said.

Ellzey was instructed to contact Waste Pro about amending the current contract and city attorney Norm D. Fugate was asked to create an ordinance for roll-off contractors.

In-person assistance is available weekdays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Career Centers in Ocala, Lecanto and Chiefland; appointments are recommended but not required.
